

Dr. Alfred Baker 27th Annual Highlights of Recent Scientific Liver Meetings: Impact on Clinical Practice

COURSE DIRECTOR: Daniel R. Ganger, MD


We have organized a multidisciplinary conference designed to address different aspects of liver disease including population health and associated disparities. Complex aspects of liver disease management, including advances in hepatobiliary cancer treatment and methods to improve access to liver transplantation, will be discussed.

This educational program is focused toward healthcare professionals involved in the care of patients with liver disease. In a five-hour session, important information presented at the recent meeting of the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases will be reviewed. Several areas of clinical hepatology will be covered and potential changes in patient management will be discussed.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

After attending this educational activity, participants should be able to:

- Apply an evidence-based approach to the management of liver disease patients in both a hospital and an office setting.
- 2. Identify treatment challenges in liver disease and access to weight loss medications.
- 3. Define current standard treatments for patients with hepatitis B, C, NASH, alcoholic liver disease, portal hypertension and liver malignancies.
- 4. Discuss the current state of liver transplantation and the management of liver transplant patients..
