CRITICAL CARE PRECOURSE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Seventy-five percent of hospitalists now care for patients in the Intensive Care Unit, indicating a pressing need for competency-based education targeted at the management of critically ill patients. The goal of the pre-course is to provide clinically relevant evidence-based updates on essential components of critical care including sepsis, acute respiratory distress syndrome, and liberation from mechanical ventilation.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe an evidence-based approach to the diagnosis and management of patients with severe sepsis and septic shock;
- 2. Demonstrate the ability to set, adjust, and troubleshoot the mechanical ventilator;
- Explain an evidence-based approach to the diagnosis and treatment of hospital-acquired and ventilator-associated pneumonia;
- 4. Describe the unique challenges of caring for critically ill patients with COVID-ARDS;
- 5. Identify best practices in the use of analgesia and sedation in the ICU.
