Now in its 17th year, this symposium is respected as a top tier regional heart failure meeting, and is once again endorsed by the Heart Failure Society of America (HFSA). Critical updates and thoughtful contemporary reviews delivered by national experts in the field, including recognized Northwestern faculty, have been the hallmark of this program. This year we will once again assemble leading cardiologists, cardiac surgeons, nurses, and psychologists with expertise in heart failure and cardiac surgery to provide updates on the very latest clinical, scientific, genetic, behavioral and technological advances for managing patients with heart failure.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- 1. Review pertinent new findings targeting the prevention and epidemiology of heart failure.
- Describe the evolution of the treatment approach to patients with cardiovascular disease and diabetes including the utility of cardiometabolic clinics.
- Recognize the important role of biomarkers in the evaluation and management of heart failure and describe new potential strategies in their utilization to improve patient outcomes
- Identify the key differences and approaches used in managing different heart failure syndromes including those with preserved, reduced, and recovered ejection fraction
- Summarize the state of advanced heart failure including the evolution of mechanical support devices and transplantation for the treatment of end stage heart failure.
- Become familiar with advances in myocarditis including the potential cardiac implications of COVID-19

- Describe the current treatment options (interventional and surgical) available for the treatment of heart failure due to specific valvular pathologies
- Identify the approach to developing a multidisciplinary heart failure program with an emphasis on optimizing transitions of care and reducing hospital readmissions
- Recognize the importance of health-related quality of life (HRQOL) and how to begin to implements HRQOL measures into clinical practice

Describe the important considerations of caring for special patient populations including the elderly when considering surgical heart failure treatment options role of the caregiver in the management of the heart failure patient including how to ensure that caregiver health and quality of life is not compromised
- **11.** Summarize the role of a palliative care team in the care of heart failure with an emphasis on earlier implementation
- 12. Describe the social determinants of health in heart failure including disparities and the importance of a social support network for optimal care and outcomes
