- identify the challenges during the diagnosis and management of complex cardiogenic shock patients and the potential benefits of a multidisciplinary team approach
- 11 Name the diagnostic and therapeutic challenges of early and late RV failure
- Develop an understanding of ECMO placement, management, and explant in combination with lung transplantation
