# Northwestern's Fourth Annual Updates in Clinical and Surgical Gynecology CME Symposium

There have been many recent advances in the treatment of patients with various gynecologic conditions yet there are still significant knowledge gaps, specifically in the diagnosis and comprehensive management of complex gynecologic issues. The content of this course helps bridge evidence-based medicine and clinical practice in the office and operating room settings.

This educational program is focused toward community healthcare professionals involved in the care of patients with gynecologic disease. Various areas of clinical and surgical gynecology will be covered, and potential changes in patient management will be discussed. In addition to our lectures, a hands-on course will be offered to allow participants to learn and practice common techniques in basic as well as advanced hysteroscopy and laparoscopy. #### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVES**
